

3rd Quarter grading (cont.)

Feb. 21st through Feb. 26th. **Chap. 12** Mult. Choice (1 more than half, 5 pts. each) and Conceptual Questions (1 more than half, 5 pts. each) and any two problems from the boxed one at the end of the chapter 10 pts. each. Others may be done for extra credit (1 pt. for M.C. or C.P. and 2 pts. for problems) **Due Monday March 4th**.

Feb. 28th through March 5th Chapters 22-24 Find **one of each of the WAVES AND OPTICS nine formulas** from the back of Chapter 22-24 and **solve them showing all work**. 10 pts. each (90 pts. total) M.C. & C.P. 1 pt. each extra credit. **Due Mon. March 11th**.

March 7th through March 12th **Chap. 27** Mult. Choice (2,3,4,9) 5 pts. each and Conceptual Questions (6,8,10) 5 pts. each and Problems 9-14 any two and 27-32 any two for 10 pts. each for a total of 75 pts. **Due Monday March 18th**

March 14th through March 18th **Chap. 28** Mult. Choice (1-9 any seven) 5 pts. each and No Conceptual Questions and Problems 1-6 any two and 7-26 any two and 27-29 any one for 10 pts. each for a total of 85 pts. **Due Friday March 22nd**.

March 19th through March 22nd **Chap. 29 whatever we get done together in class and maybe a few problems will be assigned on the Tuesday for you to get done by Friday of this week. Due Friday March 22nd** as this is the end of 3rd quarter.

4th Quarter grading

No more lectures in front of students. All students will be working at their own pace preparing for the final exam. Students will prepare by taking a practice test, grading the practice test themselves and figuring out their 0-5 grade themselves, then going over all the ones they had wrong.

If taking the exam Monday May 13th, 2013 you find which of the five sections you did poorest on (like E & M) and find a problem dealing with each of the formulas in that section and solving them. (Hand in)

Repeat above until May 13th.

If not taking the exam, you are required to go through each of the five major sections (one at a time and handing in) and find a problem in our textbook dealing with each formula and solve them consecutively. So you end up with 71 formulas, a problem for each written out completely and graded.

Everyone whether taking the final Exam on May 13th or not for 4th Quarter Grade:

Grade of C -- 1 full practice test with corrections AND all 71 formulas (non examiners); worst section problems for those taking the exam.

Grade of B --2 full practice test with corrections, **another worst section** problems for those taking the exam.

Grade of A—2 more Free Response Parts only of Exams with corrections.
